The SICU2 workshop seeks to solidify the foundation for finding, describing, organizing, preserving, and utilizing the vast resource of historic scientific instruments that reside in academic institutions. To succeed, the workshop will draw participants from a diverse, international community of scientists, historians, curators, archivists, educators, and collectors. Scientists, junior scholars, advanced graduate and undergraduate students, and people from outside academia are particularly encouraged to participate.

We are offering a limited number of workshop travel subsidies in a special effort to encourage the participation of younger scholars, people from underrepresented groups, and international experts. Highest priority for this assistance will be participating graduate students and early career professionals (within 6 years of a Ph.D or other terminal degree) from the U.S. A limited number of travel subsidies will be available for international participants, since international perspectives and experience are also vital to the success of this workshop.
